Today, I am blessed to have my life firmly planted among reiners. One horse turned into many, and the excitement has not dulled. I am thankful to be among people from every walk of life who are scattered across the globe. Like others, I was welcomed, and I've never looked back.

Over the last year, I had the privilege of serving on the board of the Reining Horse Foundation (RHF). I have witnessed dedicated, hardworking and smart individuals constantly looking for ways to support this community.

I hope you will consider being a giver. Every dollar is a meaningful gift and allows the RHF to benefit others. I am forever grateful to this community that helps fill my heart with joy every day.
